2nd SUMMER SPECTACULAR SHOW

August 20-21st, 2010 – Marathon County Fair Park – Wausau, Wisconsin

ENTRY DEADLINE: July 31, 2010

ELIGIBILITY: Youth must be between the ages of 8-19 years of age as of January 1, 2010. Must be a WI resident and a 2010 WLBA paid member or family.

SCHEDULE: Friday, August 20th, 2010

Livestock may start arriving at 4 pm.

5:30-7:00 PM Early Check In-Weigh In for Beef/Swine

Saturday, August 21st, 2010

7:30-9 AM Beef Weigh-Scales will close at 9 a.m.

7:30-9 AM Sheep Weigh in-Check in. Scales will close at 9 a.m.

7:30-8:30 AM Swine Weigh in-Check in. Scales close at 8:30 a.m.

Check in-Weigh in times will be strictly enforced. Please allow yourself enough time to get through lines before scales or registration tables close!

9-10:00 AM Educational Contest w/Awards (judging/quiz)

10:30 AM Swine Show starts w/breeding gilts-market hogs-showmanship

10:30 AM Sheep show starts w/breeding stock-market-showmanship

10:30 AM Beef show starts w/breeding stock-steers-showmanship

GENERAL SHOW RULES:

All animals are to be fed, fitted, entered and shown by the exhibitor. Family members and other junior exhibitors are allowed to help. In case of an emergency, another junior exhibitor may show said animals upon prior consent of the species chairman.

Registration papers must be in the name of the exhibitor or in his/her parents or farm name. To be eligible for Bred and Owned competition, the breeder and the owner of the animal must be in the exhibitors name only.

An exhibitor may enter animals in any two species. Substitute entries WILL be allowed within species and class-please contact the WLBA office as soon as possible with all substitution requests.

There will be no re-weighing of market animals.

Materials may not be used to change the color of an animal. If natural color is altered the animal will be disqualified. There will be no painting of sheep to either alter or enhance color.

No medicines can be given to an animal at the show without a vets or species chairman's approval. Blood or urine tests may be taken if a complaint is filed regarding irregular use of drugs. If the tests are positive, the exhibitor will incur any costs for testing and will be banned from future WLBA shows.

Any animal that has been altered through surgical procedures will be disqualified and the exhibitor's status at future shows will be determined by the show committee.

There will be no smoking in the barns, use of controlled substances, or alcohol on the grounds by either exhibitors or adults.

Interpretation of rule infraction rests with the show committee which has the authority to bar an exhibitor from exhibiting at this show or other WLBA shows. The Executive Director will serve in an advisory position on any rule infraction.

All pens, stalls, and fitting areas must be cleaned thoroughly before exhibitors leave. Check your exhibitor letter for details. A clean-up charge will be assessed to all violators.

SHOWMANSHIP: Showmanship age break downs as of January 1, 2010:
8-9, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15, 16-19

BEEF RULES:

Exhibitor may show up to 5 heifers and 3 steers. Heifers must be born after September 1, 2008. Steers must be born after January 1, 2009. Heifers must be purchased by May 1, 2010. Heifers without papers, Crossbred heifers, or lower percentage heifers will be shown as a Commercial breed. An exhibitor may exhibit one managerial heifer upon filing appropriate paperwork.

Purebred heifers must be 75% or more purebred and must carry an ear tattoo corresponding to the registration papers. Heifers will be shown by breed with classes determined after all heifers have been checked in. Exhibitors may also enter cow/calf pairs. Steers must carry a state or county fair tag. Steers will be shown by breed and weight. Purebred Angus and Hereford steers need registration papers in the exhibitor's name. If there are less than 5 steers in one breed, that breed will show in Any Other Breeds. No dairy steers will be shown. In case of a question on a steer's breed purity, the steer will be blood

tested at the expense of the person questioning the purity. The testing expenses will be refunded if the complaint is proven correct. No steers with horns longer than 1" from the hair line will show. Loosely attached scurs are permitted to show.

No butt fans allowed.

SWINE RULES:

Barrows and gilts are eligible for entry. Each exhibitor may show up to 4 pigs. Eight pigs may be identified; ear notch/tag number should be provided on entry. Market hogs will be shown by weight, in either the Purebred or Crossbred Divisions. Registration papers are required for the Purebred Division. Breeding gilts will be shown by age in either the Purebred or Crossbred Division. All pigs are required to provide proof of on the farm veterinary inspection papers.

SHEEP RULES:

Exhibitors may show 4 ewes, and 4 rams in each breed they are showing and a total of 5 market lambs. Crossbred lambs are considered a breed. Exhibitors must provide registration papers on breeding sheep. All sheep must carry an ear tag corresponding to registration papers. Ewes without proper papers and crossbred ewes will show as a commercial and/or wether type ewe. Rams without proper papers will not show. Ewes, rams, and lambs must be purchased by June 1, 2010. Exhibitors are allowed to enter one animal in each class of breeding sheep.

Ewe/Ram Classes: Yearling Ewe & Rams must be born after September 1, 2008. Winter lambs: born between Jan 1-Feb 15, 20010. Spring lambs: born on or after February 16, 20010. Fall lambs: born between Sept 1-Dec 31, 2009

Sheep showing symptoms of any contagious disease will not be permitted to show. ALL sheep (ewes, rams and market lambs) need scrapie tags. No drenching and muzzles are allowed. Infractions will result in disqualification.

Two exhibitors are allowed to show breeding sheep only-exhibitors must be at the head of the animal being shown.

Market Lamb Classes: Lambs must be born after January 1, 2010. Lambs will be shown by breed and weight. If there are less than 5 lambs in one breed, that breed will show as Any Other Breeds. No patch shearing will be allowed on lambs. Lambs must not have more than one-half inch of wool. No tubes or blankets allowed on lambs during weigh-in. Lambs will be allowed over the scale one time. Weight and breed determination is final.

Lead Class: Open to all exhibitors. Ewes or wethers may be used in this class. A Lead Class animal must be owned by the immediate family. Entrants shall wear attire made of wool fabrics. The class shall be judged on percentages as follows; 40% on exhibitor attire, 30% on presentation of sheep-showmanship, 30% on personality and knowledge of project of exhibitor during interview. Entrants shall provide the sheep chairman with a lead class entry form by no later than the 7:30-9:00 a.m. check-in.

MASTER STOCKMAN APPLICATIONS: Two applicants per species will be chosen to advance to the state competition in March of 2011. Master Stockman winners in each species will receive \$750 and Runner Ups will receive \$500. Master Stockman applicants or their immediate families must be paid 2010 WLBA members. Master Stockman applicants must have shown at a WLBA show for the past three out of five years.

JACKPOT AWARDS: \$200 will be awarded to the Grand Champion Heifer & Steer, the Grand Champion Overall Breeding Sheep & Market Lamb and the Grand Champion Overall Hog. \$100 will be awarded to the Reserves in each category listed above.

DEADLINES: Entry deadline and fees will be strictly enforced. Exhibitors who submit entries that are not postmarked by July 31, 2010 will be assessed a double entry fee. Late entries will be accepted until August 20 with paid double entry fees. No day of show entries will be accepted.

MAIL: Entries should be mailed to WLBA, 7811 N. Consolidated School Rd, Edgerton, WI 5334. Postmarks of July 31st, 2010 or earlier are required to avoid late entry fees.
