MASTER STOCKMAN AWARD APPLICATION**

The Case IH Master Stockman Award is one of the most prestigious awards given to junior livestock project exhibitors and is generously sponsored by Case IH. The Master Stockman Award recognizes knowledge, skill, leadership, and excellence within beef, sheep, meat goat and swine project work.

Case IH Master Stockman Award Requirements & Rules:

- 1) All Master Stockman applicants and/or their immediate families must be paid 2023 WLBA members. Membership applications can be found online at www.wisconsinlivestockbreeders.com and should be sent with your application.
- 2) The Master Stockman Scholarship is available to youth not younger than a high school senior graduating in 2023 or not older than 21 years of age by January 1, 2023.
- 3) Applicants must have participated in one or a combination of the following events: the WLBA Spring Preview, the Wisconsin Livestock Show Camp or the WLBA Summer Spectacular Show a minimum of three out of the last five years (2018-2022).
- 4) Master Stockman applicants must apply within one species only; beef, sheep, meat goats, or swine.
- 5) Previous Master Stockman winners within any species are not eligible to reapply.
- 6) Previous Honorable Mention Master Stockman winners may reapply within any species; if they still meet all requirements, but they will be eligible to receive a monetary award no more than twice.

Case IH Master Stockman Scholarship Process:

- A original hard copy of the Master Stockman Award application (to be filed), AND (3) additional copies (that will be mailed to our judges) should be mailed to the WLBA office with a postmark date of no later than February 28, 2023. Applications not postmarked by February 28, 2023, will not be considered. Additionally, please do not send your application certified mail with a required signature as there is no one available to sign upon delivery.
- An electronic copy of your application in PDF form only (please, no Google doc files) and a scanned picture, of yourself MUST also be emailed to the WLBA office by no later than 11:59 pm on February 28, 2023. Please email this to wisconsinlivestockbreeders@gmail.com.
- Up to a maximum of 10 applications, based on the quality of applications submitted, regardless of species, will be chosen to advance to an interview to be held on March 18, 2023. Time and location is to be determined, dependent on interview numbers. All applicants must be able to interview on March 18, 2023, if chosen.
- From the applicants interviewed, (3) \$1000 Master Stockman Award winners and (2) \$250 Honorable Mention Master Stockman Awards will be selected.
- Checks will be awarded at the Wisconsin State Fair by Case IH.

Master Stockman Application Tips:

- Applicants should answer each question as it pertains to their project as completely as possible. Your application will be judged on the depth of the knowledge of your project and your documented involvement and leadership shown in the livestock industry.
- A scanned picture of yourself should be included on your cover page with your personal information.
- Additional photos are not required, but a few are encouraged to document and enhance your application. Please scan photos directly into your electronic application, do not send hard copies.
- Criteria for the interview process will include knowledge of your project, presentation and knowledge of your application, and the ability to communicate and answer questions.

Claire Hawthorne is 20 years old and the daughter of Jim & Kim Hawthorne of Westby. Claire will be a junior at Iowa State University this fall majoring in Agribusiness. Claire’s livestock career began at the age of six when she started showing bred and owned heifers and steers from her families purebred Angus herd. Claire notes that her family strives to breed cattle that will succeed in the showing, on the rail, and in the pasture and that by working with her family she has been introduced to one of her greatest passions in life; agriculture. Today, Claire owns a herd of about 30 registered Angus cattle and has had numerous leadership roles within the beef industry. She has served on the Wisconsin Junior Angus Association board of directors; she was selected to run for the 2017 Miss American Angus title, and she served as a committee chair for the 2018 National Junior Angus Show. Claire states that growing up, surrounded by leaders it was easy for her to accept the position as a follower, but her involvement in the beef industry has taught her to be an adaptive leader with the ability to recognize the potential in others as well.
