Participants are asked to work out of their trailers, unless you are transporting animals by truck. Limited penning/stalling is available and anyone using pens or stalls will be required to clean their area before they leave. Grass surrounding your trailer will also need to be thoroughly raked and either taken home or disposed of.

What to bring: Bring what you would typically bring to a show. Feed, water buckets, hose, grooming supplies, halter, show sticks, pig whips, etc.... Optional: Lawn chairs and a cooler with additional beverages.

<u>For Swine Show Campers Only:</u> Please read swine requirements below carefully and bring a copy of your Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that the WLBA staff can retain. We will not have a copier available, so if you forget to bring a copy your original form will be retained. We are required by the state to retain copies of all CVI's for 5 years.

Swine moving within Wisconsin must have a CVI with the following:

- 1. Animal identification (USDA 840 button ear tag, county fair tag, or ear notch)
- 2. Statement (on CVI) that a veterinarian has inspected the entire herd of origin within the past 30 days before the show and that no apparent disease was present at the time of inspection. Statement must also include:
- 3. Farm of origin of has not had pseudorabies or swine dysentery in the past 12 months, has not had any clinical signs or diagnosis of TGE or PEDV in the past 60 days, feeds no garbage, uses no PRV vaccine, is not under quarantine for any disease condition and vesicular stomatitis has not been diagnosed within 10 miles of the farm of origin within the past 30 days.
 - a. <u>Testing for Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome (PRRS) and Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea Virus</u> (PEDv) is required as follows:
 - i. If Negative tests of herd of origin within 90 days prior to movement, pigs can move to fairs or shows as noted above. Documentation of the negative test results must be made available upon request. **Test results, test type, and date of testing need to be included on the CVI.**
 - ii. If Positive tests for either PRRS or PEDv of herd of origin within 90 days prior to movement, the herd will be quarantined until a herd plan is established and approved. Swine may be able to move to the fair or show in accordance with the herd plan. Include the test results, test type, date of testing, and Herd Plan number on the CVI.
